Keeping safety a top priority.

As safety manager, the role is responsible for developing, updating, and maintaining safety, food safety, and environmental compliance programs. A safety manager maintains reports and verifies compliance, as well as supervises employees, contractors and visitors. By spending a significant amount of time in the plant, a safety manager ensures all programs and procedures are adequate and being followed. Based on safety programs and policies, the safety manager looks to not only sustain, but also improve current behaviors in the facility to continuously ensure safety. Should an incident occur, the safety manager is responsible for leading and participating in all investigations to identify root cause. Self-assessments and internal audits help the safety manager develop and track corrective actions for any findings.

Career Responsibilities

- Develop, analyze and submit safety reports
- Calibrate and repair safety equipment
- Supervise the implementation of policies and procedures
- Develop and present training for new hires, contractors, and location colleagues as required
- Purchase and maintain inventory of safety, food safety, and environmental supplies
- Develop and maintain proper document retention
- Maintain required paperwork, such as OSHA 300 logs in compliance with federal law
- Lead and participate in on-site safety committee
- Personally demonstrate a commitment to food and human safety
